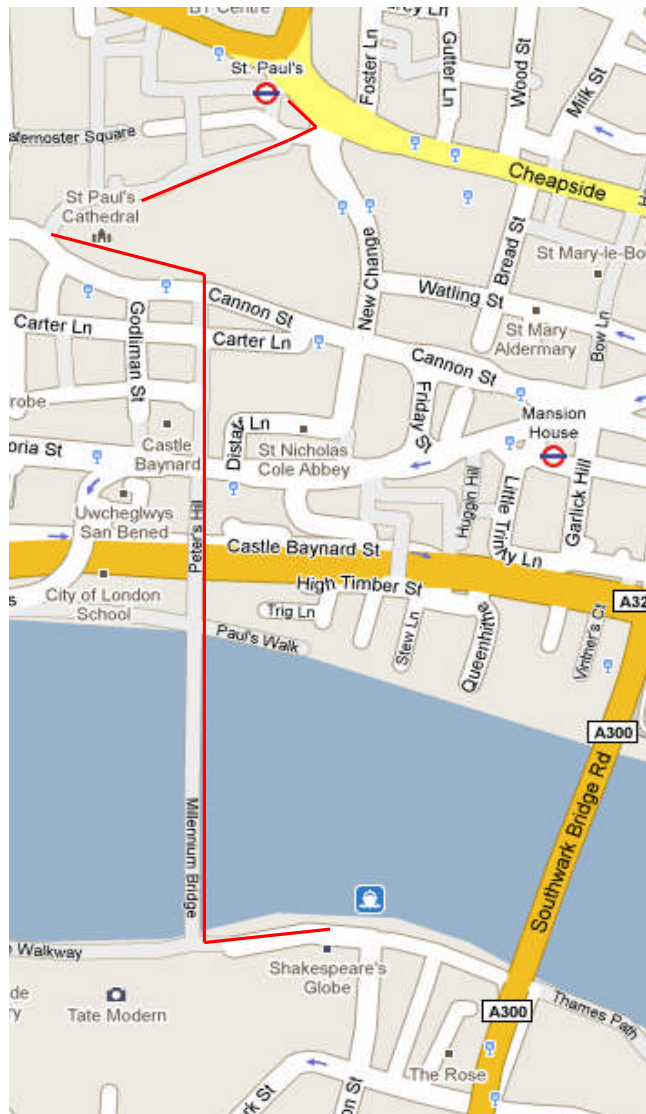
Wednesday, September 9th
